



The project Numina Femenina, Latin Women in the Arts, fosters the exhibition and discussion of contemporary art encouraging cultural development through the scope of Hispanic women's artistic production. Numina Femenina covers the art from its different disciplines, such as visual arts, literature, film, music, and dance. The project takes place in the Consulate General of Mexico in San Francisco, a heterotopy space where geographical barriers disappear and consequently intensify the cross-cultural exchange between countries. By taking art out of conventional spaces such as museums and conferences rooms, Numina Femenina aims to encourage women's development by generating spaces for artistic creation and its exposure.
